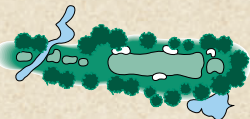


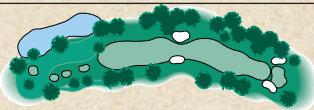

This wide fairway is waiting for the first shot of the day. Play down right-middle of fairway to avoid bunkers. A par can start the day right.

2

This hole is entirely uphill, however getting "home" in two is not uncommon for the long hitters. Grab an extra club on the approach.

An elevated tee offers a clear view of the green. A cross wind will present a challenge for this mid to long iron shot.

The shortest par four on the front side. A good tee shot will leave you with a short iron to a wide, two-tiered green.

Drive away from deep bunkers on the right side of the fairway. Carefully check pin placement on this deep green. Long is not an option.

6

A double fairway on the second shot allows an alternate route to the pin. The left side is favored, opening the preferred angle to a hillside green.



7



A long dogleg right with bunkers framing the fairway. A good drive leaves the player with another testing long iron shot to the green.

8

Club selection is paramount on this water framed golf hole. The green stretches from right to left and slopes from back to front. Swirling breezes can challenge the tee shot.



9



This hole expects the player to drive from a tree-lined chute to a fairway flanked by trees and a deep ravine. A long second shot to a lake side green setting makes this par 4 a very challenging finish to the front side.

PACE OF PLAY

Four hour golf reminders:
Keep pace with group ahead.
Play "ready" golf (Hit when ready).
Carry extra clubs when leaving your cart.
Line up putts while others are putting.
Mark scores at next tee.

RULES OF PLAY

USGA Rules will Govern all Play.
All out of bounds are marked by white stakes or boundary fences.
All lateral water hazards are marked by red stakes or red lines.
All sprinkler head distances are lasered to the center of the green.
All yardage markers in fairways are represented by the following:
Black (250), Blue (200), White (150) and Red (100).

ETIQUETTE

Proper attire must be worn at all times.
Players are reminded to please repair your ball mark and one other, fill all divots with sand mixture and rake bunkers smooth.
